Every moment is another opportunity to become the best-version-ofourselves!



THE DEACON'S CORNER

Advent is the season of expectations. This is the time of the taking the breath before the plunge, to prepare ourselves for the Advent of God coming to earth. Please explain to your children the meaning of the Advent wreath and the names of the four Sundays in Advent.

DARKNESS AND LIGHT

The Advent candles readily demonstrate the strong contrast between darkness and light. In the Bible, Christ is referred to as the "Light of the World" contrasted with the darkness of sin. Human history spanned long ages before our prophesied Savior would finally make his appearance, and God's promise to make all things new through him.



As his Advent, or "coming," draws nearer another candle is lit, with each

candle dispelling the darkness a little more. Thus, the Advent wreath helps us to spiritually contemplate the great drama of salvation history that surrounds the birth of God Incarnate who comes to redeem the human race.

- The <u>1st Sunday of Advent</u> symbolizes Hope with the <u>"Prophet's Candle"</u> reminding us that Jesus is coming.
- The <u>2nd Sunday of Advent</u> symbolizes Faith with the <u>"Bethlehem Candle"</u> reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem, which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ.
- The <u>3rd Sunday of Advent</u> symbolizes Joy with the <u>"Shepherd's Candle"</u> reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.
- The <u>4th Sunday of Advent</u> symbolizes Peace with the <u>"Angel's Candle"</u> reminding us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

Just an added note of <u>the importance of the children coming to Mass regularly on weekends with their families</u>. On weekdays they attend Mass during Faith Formation sessions, but the children need to pray with their moms

and dads at Mass also on the weekends. Praying together strengthens a family in more ways than we'll ever realize!!!! Joshua says, "as for me and my house, we will serve God."
