FATHER ANTHONY'S GUIDANCE

Where there are lies, there can be no love.

Lying or being inauthentic is seriously wrong because it hinders or harms human relationships. Where there are lies, there is no love-one cannot have love.

To live a life "of inauthentic communication" is serious because it obstructs relationships and, therefore, it obstructs love.

"You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor," which, according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, forbids misrepresenting the truth.

"We are always communicating," whether with words, gestures, one's behavior and even by being silent or absent. People communicate by who they are and what they do, as well as by what they say, which means people are always at a crossroads, "perched" between telling the truth or lies.

"But what does the truth mean?"

It is not enough to be sincere, because someone could be sincere about a mistaken belief, and it is not enough to be precise because someone could hide the full meaning of a situation behind a barrage of insignificant details.

Sometimes, people think that revealing other people's personal business and confidential information is fine also because, "I only told the truth."

Gossip, however, destroys communion by being indiscreet and inconsiderate.

The tongue is like a knife, and "gossip kills," destroying people and their reputation.

"So then, what is the truth?"

The ultimate model of truth is Jesus, who came into the world "to testify to the truth." As He told Pontius Pilate, "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to My voice," according to the Gospel of John (18:37).

To follow Jesus is to live "in the Spirit of truth" and bear witness to God's truth, merciful love and fidelity.

"Every person affirms or negates this truth with their every act — from minor everyday situations to more serious choices," so people need to ask themselves whether they are upright and truthful in their words and deeds, "or am I more or less a liar disguised as truth?"

"Christians are not exceptional boys and girls. But they are children of the heavenly Father, Who is good, Who does not disappoint and Who puts in our heart the love for our brothers and sisters."

"This truth is not spoken so much with a speech. It is a way of being, a way of living and you see it in every single deed."

"To not bear false witness means to live like children of God who never ever refutes" or contradicts Himself, and never tells lies.

It is living in a way that every deed reveals "the great truth that God is the Father and that you can trust in Him," he said. God "loves me, He loves us and (from that) springs my truth, to be truthful and not deceitful."

THE HISPANIC COMMUNITY

Within the Hispanic community, February begins with the celebration on February 2 of "Candelaria", which is also the Presentation of the Lord, the Purification of Mary and Candlemas. This is the traditional end of the Christmas

season and many families have a special ritual as they put the image of the Child Jesus away for another year. As a community after the 11:00 am Mass there will be a gathering in the gym.

On January 5, when we celebrated the feast of Epiphany, the King cake with three small figures hidden inside, was divided. The families who received a piece with an "infant" will now bring tamales for Candelaria, to be shared by all. Together we say farewell to Christmas.

At the end of February, we begin the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday, Feb. 26, invites us with a full schedule of Masses. In addition, there will be a Service in Spanish at 7:30 pm at St. Damian. With the mark of the ashes we enter into the six weeks to walk with Jesus, with prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

To help us get ready, on Friday, Feb. 21, the women of the parish invite us to the Mexican Fish Fry. A full menu including: Tamales! Fish Tacos! Margaritas!

En la comunidad Hispana iniciamos el mes de febrero con la fiesta de Candelaria el 2, que es también la Presentación del Señor en el Templo, la Purificación de Maria, y el día cuando bendecían las velas para uso durante el año. En la fiesta de Reyes, cuando partimos la rosca, a tres personas les tocó un monito, una figura de niño y ahora les toca traer tamales. Juntos nos despedimos de la Navidad.

A fines de febrero entramos en la temporada de Cuaresma. Miercoles de Ceniza, 26 de febrero, con un horario amplio de Misas. Tambien habrá Servicio en Español a las 7:30pm en S. Damian. Con la cruz en la frente, entramos a las seis semanas a caminar con Jeus con oracion, ayuno y sacrificio.

Como un primer paso, las Damas de la Parroquia nos invitan a un Frito de Pescado a estilo Mexicano. El menu complete incluye: Tamales! Tacos de Pescado! Margaritas!

How to recite the Holy Rosary

1. SAY THESE PRAYERS...

IN THE NAME of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. (As you say this, with your right hand touch your forehead when you say Father, touch your breastbone when you say Son, touch your left shoulder when you say Holy, and touch your right shoulder when you say Spirit.)

I BELIEVE IN GOD, the Father almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into Hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty. He shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

OUR FATHER, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

HAIL MARY, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.

GLORY BE to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

O MY JESUS, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of Hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy. Amen.

HAIL HOLY QUEEN, mother of mercy; our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn, then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us. And after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.

O GOD, WHOSE only-begotten Son by His life, death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life; grant, we beseech Thee, that by meditating upon these mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

ANNOUNCE each mystery by saying something like, "The third Joyful Mystery is the Birth of Our Lord." This is required only when saying the Rosary in a group.


