What is Laetare Sunday?

The Fourth Sunday of Lent (March 31st) is called Laetare Sunday. The Church takes a bit of breather from the Lenten practice and opens Mass with the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice, Jerusalem ... Be joyful, all who were in mourning!" – taken from Isaiah chapter 66.

That doesn't sound right! Are we supposed to "Rejoice!" in the middle of Lent? Indeed we are! On this Sunday, we look with expectation to the great Solemnity of Easter for which we have been preparing ourselves as a Church during the Lenten season. By its anticipation of the joy of Easter, Laetare Sunday is meant to give us hope and encouragement as we slowly progress towards the Paschal Feast.

Just an added note of the importance of the children coming to Mass regularly on weekends with their families. On weekdays they attend Mass during Faith Formation sessions, but the children need to pray with their moms and dads at Mass also on the weekends. Praying together strengthens a family in more ways than we'll ever realize!!!! Joshua says, "as for me and my house, we will serve God."

THE HISPANIC COMMUNITY

As we end March and begin April, we come to the heart of Lent. The daily readings and participation in Lenten activities remind us to let our efforts at conversion deepen.

In the current climate there is a lot said about who belongs and who doesn't. The people of Clinton County have welcomed the brothers and sisters coming from Mexico and Central America, though often we prefer to keep a distance. In these remaining weeks of Lent perhaps we can find ways to recognize a little more the face of Jesus in each one we meet.

The Spanish word for Easter is "Pascua" related to the "Paschal" mystery – the suffering, death and resurrection of our Savior. The Hispanic community will share in the bilingual celebration of Holy Thursday at St. Bernard at 7pm, walk the Way of the Cross on Good Friday at St. Damian at 7:30pm, and celebrate Easter on Sunday at the 11:00 Mass. To each of you: !Felices Pascuas de las Flores!
