School Faith Formation Project

All of the classes have decided to focus on the 8 Beatitudes this year.

From September through April, we will concentrate on a different beatitude each month.

On Friday mornings, before we go to our individual classrooms, we will discuss what the particular beatitude means to us, and how we can live out that beatitude every day that month.

The kids have learned a catchy little song (with "actions" to go along with it) that sing about the beatitudes and how Jesus has blessed us with them.

We start each day with the

Guardian Angel Prayer. Parents, please remember to say these prayers with your children. They tend to "forget" if the prayers are not said on a frequent basis.

The past several weeks we have been learning about the church year, or the Liturgical Year. They are learning the chronological order of the Liturgical Year, what actually takes place during each season, and the color of vestments the priest/deacons wear during a particular season.

We have learned about Helen Keller, who had an illness that left her unable to see or hear. We read how she overcame her many obstacles in learning how to communicate and express her thoughts and feelings.
