FATHER ANTHONY'S GUIDANCE

Opinions

We can see the same thing and yet have our individual and differing points of view and opinions. We are entitled to our opinions. Our opinions are neither right nor wrong, because we see it from our own angle and perspective. However, when we impose our opinions on others, and put a judgement tag to it, then that is where other moral issues may arise.

Let us always remember that everyone's opinion is important, but not everyone's opinion is a fact! Others may be influenced by our judgements, which are actually mere opinions, and they in turn will subscribe to the same judgement.

"You should never pass judgement on a brother or treat him with contempt, as some of you have done. We shall all have to stand before the judgement seat of God. It is to God therefore that each of us must give an account of himself." (Rm. 14, 10)

When the tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what He had to say, the Pharisees and the scribes complained, and made a judgement when they said, 'This man welcomes sinners and eats with them.' In addition, even when we hear the parable of the shepherd leaving the ninety-nine in the wilderness to look for the missing one, we might think it is rather absurd to do so. However, if we are that missing one, then we will certainly change our opinions.

So instead of letting our opinions turn into a judgement, let us judge ourselves first. Then we will be able to give an account of ourselves before God.

THE DEACON'S CORNER

Advent is the season of expectations. This is the time of the taking the breath before the plunge, to prepare ourselves for the Advent of God coming to earth. Please explain to your children the meaning of the Advent wreath and the names of the four Sundays in Advent.

DARKNESS AND LIGHT

The Advent candles readily demonstrate the strong contrast between darkness and light. In the Bible, Christ is referred to as the "Light of the World" contrasted with the darkness of sin. Human history spanned long ages before our prophesied Savior would finally make his appearance, and God's promise to make all things new through Him.

As His Advent, or "coming," draws nearer another candle is lit, with each candle dispelling the darkness a little more. Thus, the Advent wreath helps us spiritually contemplate the great drama of salvation history that surrounds the birth of God Incarnate who comes to redeem the human race.

- The 1st Sunday of Advent symbolizes Hope with the "Prophet's Candle" reminding us that Jesus is coming.
- The 2nd Sunday of Advent symbolizes Faith with the "Bethlehem Candle" reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem, which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ.
- The 3rd Sunday of Advent symbolizes Joy with the "Shepherd's Candle" reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.
- The 4th Sunday of Advent symbolizes Peace with the "Angel's Candle" reminding us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."



Just an added note of the <u>importance of the children coming to Mass regularly on weekends with their families.</u>
On weekdays they attend Mass during Faith Formation sessions, but the children need to pray with their moms and dads at Mass also on the weekends. Praying together strengthens a family in more ways than we'll ever realize!!!! Joshua says', "as for me and my house, we will serve God".

December is a very busy time for the Hispanic community. The first Sunday of Advent with the Advent wreath and the liturgy's focus on the coming of the Messiah in our time comes at the same time that we are preparing to celebrate the feast of our Lady of Guadalupe. This a very important celebration because it speaks not only of the apparition in a religious sense but it also proclaims Mary's particular intervention when Mexico and all of Latin America had been subjugated by Europe (Spain and Portugal) in the name of God. Mary shared the compassion of a mother and won the heart of the nation.

We gather on December 7 at 10 pm to serenade (las mañanitas) Mary. Then on Sunday, we celebrate with Mass at 11:00 am and the fiesta. A mariachi group will provide music for the Mass and the fiesta.

Also in December, with the posadas, we recall the journey of Mary and Joseph seeking shelter where Jesus could be born. Dec. 16 at St. Damian, Dec. 20 at St. Dominic, Dec. 21 at St. Bernard, Dec. 22 at St. Anthony in Beckemeyer. Each night at 6:30 pm. The Christmas Mass will be on December 24 at 7 pm.
